## **HEIR Continues to Raise** Awareness of the EAS Sector

Horse and Hound has been regularly checking in with the progress of the Register and has featured several articles. It is important that the equestrian world at large knows about and understand the benefits that horses can bring. In particular, some horses are better suited to this type of activity than other disciplines and it may prove beneficial for the horse to participate in this powerful partnership. Horse and Hound recently featured a full feature about the benefits and HEIR was cited and quoted in the piece.

## EAS Partnership is Set to Become CiC

The Charity Commission decided not to approve the application to establish the Equine Assisted Services Partnership as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).

The Steering Group held a Planning Day in August and discussed several options for the best way forwards and has agreed to work towards establishing the Equine Assisted Partnership in the UK as a Community Interest Company (CiC).

This will be the right framework, as it will provide similar benefits to a charity in that it would allow us to function as a non-profit, limited by guarantee, company which is still able to attract some grant and charity funding. The constitution will remain true to the purpose and benefits that were consulted about last year. Over the summer, we have been working to establish this method of obtaining transparent governance with members' involvement. Once we have undertaken the necessities such as a bank account, insurance, new website to host the Register etc. there will be an open process to appoint some new directors to the EAS Partnership CIC board. This process will involve the membership in an inclusive and democratic way.

Further details will be communicated in early 2024.
